

# Harimau Untuk Selamanya

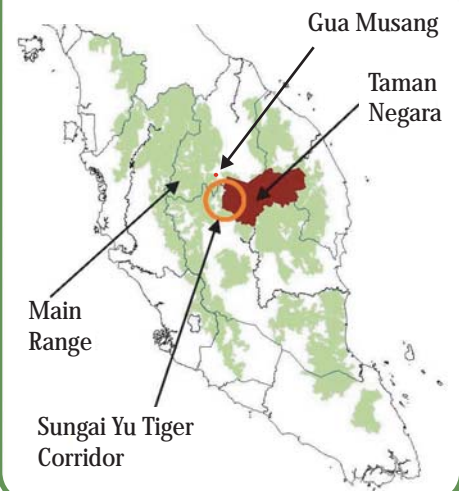


Gua Musang is located in the state of Kelantan, about 30 minutes from the western entrance to Taman Negara National Park at Sungai Relau, Merapoh. Its proximity to this priority conservation area for tigers as well as the Main Range forests has made it a major hotspot for poaching and trade. It is also located close to the porous national border, which facilitates smuggling activities.

As part of a campaign to reduce local trade and consumption of tigers and other wildlife, MYCAT outreach programmes were held from 12 to 16 July 2012 in the Gua Musang town.

The MYCAT team, aided by 11 volunteers, went from shop to shop in Gua Musang, speaking to shop owners and passersby, distributing materials to promote the Wildlife Crime Hotline (019 356 4194) and putting up posters publicising the freeze on deer hunting. The volunteers also publicised the new Wildlife Conservation Act 2010, which allows for much sterner penalties to be meted out to wildlife criminals.
